#### A Message from Fr. David

Religious Education of children and Youth continues to change and adapt with the times. It is a difficult sojourn. Priests and their staff or volunteers who concern themselves with this important ministry, constantly confront other schedules more important than the faith (it seems), and so parents enable their children (maybe not willfully, but it happens) to lower the priority that the Faith has vs. Everything Else! And by everything else I mean everything.

Everything that you can image will defeat a Religious Education Night or Morning for many. I've heard it all. I will spare you the list. Now there are some kids who can't even be "forced," cajoled or persuaded by rightful authorities (parents/grandparents/ foster parents) to go to Religious Education, because the choice is theirs to make. I just recently witnessed someone "negotiate" terms with their 6 year old son over a command that had been given concerning carrots. It was stated that if he ate one of three carrots left on his plate there would be a food related reward for him at morning breakfast. Of course he said "no." Why wouldn't you say no? It is a negotiation. In my childhood, I wouldn't have been caught dead (or I would have ended up dead) saying "no" to Ma or Dad when I was six. Or I would have sat at the table until the carrots had dried up and were green and moldy. And that (my friends) was just the reality of life.

Now I can't get into the differences between the 70's and the Teens or "Tensies" (as they call them these days) in terms of parenting styles and their effectiveness, but I will ask you this instead:

- o Who is more important than God?
- o What is more important than your faith?
- o Do you want to avoid Eternal Death and be brought into the Heavenly Kingdom?
- o How about your children? Saved / Don't Really Care? Do you realize that the vast majority of us will never achieve proximity to the level of greatness that we dreamed about in our youth? For example I was going to play in the NFL, (when I planned out my life as a 4th grader) but I never even played High School Football. It's a simple truth that we don't usually fulfill our earliest dreams and aspirations and yet there is one thing that can be achieved in children, teens, adults and the elderly alike. What is this one thing? In every age (no matter how young, not matter how old) you can be...

Who is more important than God, What is more important than your faith, Do you want to go to Heaven and have your children with you? You know the answer but are you willing to prioritize your life around the answer?






CAGE Night begins on October 3 at 6:30 with registration and Holy Hour, followed by snacks. Parents should plan to attend with their students.
