

A Message from Father David

So prioritizing your life to the noble end of becoming a Saint is everything and all that this life is about here on earth. Preparing oneself in every way to do God's will (above all things) is the key to happiness. Avoiding near occasions of sin and the choices to inflict evil upon anyone or even upon oneself is a daily task. Knowing the difference between good and evil and having a well formed conscience to make moral decisions is set firmly upon the training of our childhood, not only from our parents and grandparents but from our school teachers too.

It is safe to say that the passing on of the Catholic Faith through Catholic Schools and Catholic Educators has dropped down on our priorities lists in the last 3 or 4 decades. **Firstly**, there has developed a problem of faith. The Faith just isn't as important to people as it has been. This is a simple truth. **Second**, for many, the cost and time commitment to a private, Catholic education for their children is more than they can bear financially. When public school is "free" and the faith doesn't mean as much to the constituents over all, the choice is easy. Third, because of the resources the public system has, their teachers are getting paid better and the public school is able to offer more diverse and individualized programs to the students. Finally, there is also the reality of parents who choose home-schooling over the other two options. This group of dedicated individuals is becoming more populous especially in rural areas. Most homeschoolers do a great job of handing on the faith and even though it is their right to educate their children it has had an adverse effect on Catholic Schools (in some way).

Training to become a Saint is not an easy task without help. Within the Catholic School setting one's environment is conducive for growth through prayer, discipline, correction and study. Standards of behavior are set that have as their foundation the Commandments, the Bible and Church Teachings. And then there is prayer. Within the Catholic School opportunities to go to Mass and confession, to pray devotional prayers like the Rosary or Stations and to pray in the classroom together are all present. The spiritual muscle exercised in Catholic Schools is the major difference between us and the public schools.

I know there is more to be said about this but for this week I want to leave you with a thought about St. Thomas Aquinas Elementary School in International Falls, MN and Fr. Ben Hadrich. Last weekend he presided at our Masses and gave a pitch about the school he shepherds on the border. I know that he touched some of you because he left here with \$2,400.00 for his scholarship program. We didn't expect that at all. **Thank You!!!** Our two parishes in Aitkin County are being called to consider how we can help this school's mission and ministry in a far -away place. Do you share a concern for them and why?

Finally, like all schools, St. Thomas Aguinas in the Falls has a mascot

for their school community, they are known as the... **SAINTS**. More to come...




